

RMP acts as a community advocate to find new stages and opportunities for our artists to perform.


From Roots to Red Rocks

Growing hometown superstars

Our Artist Development program features a unique blend of education and real-life performance opportunities. We focus on creating artists with grit and self-reliance. Hometown superstars are all around us but they need our help to realize their dreams.

Mid-size venues are crucial to success

Mid-size venues (100 to 250 seats) have disappeared from most cities. RMP fills the gap on the path to artists success.







42% Youth Performers

42% of RMP's events included at least one performer 24 years old or under. Arts funding in schools is being slashed and RMP helps fill the gap.

25% People with Disabilities

25% of RMP's events included at least one person with a disability. 77% of our performers strongly agree that RMP helped improve their mental health.

63% People of Color

Music creates opportunity and understanding. 63% of RMP's events included at least one person of color.

20,000+ Audience Reach

Our performers will be exposed to over 20,000 fans this year.

200+ Performance Opportunities

Musicians need gigs! Each year RMP provides over 200 performance opportunities for Boulder area musicians.

2,000+ Performers per year

We pack our events with multiple artists at all experience levels to give more musicians a chance to perform in front of an audience.

\$500K Jobs to Artists & Music Pro's

This year RMP will pay over half a million dollars directly to musicians and music industry professionals.

83% Budget Dollars for Program Services

In 2023, 83% of RMPs budget was spent on programs that help our community. 8% was spent on on fundraising and 9% on Management and Administrative.

Ian Steele



KGNU

Leveraging Reach: KGNU Boulder non-profit radio station is a powerful media source for local musicians. KGNU and RMP cross-promote events. RMP hosts multiple events for KGNU. RMP's collaboration with KGNU provides our musicians a powerful way to reach a large local audience.

Boulder Int'l Film Festival

Creating performance opportunities: For the past two years, RMP provided booking, curation and logistic support for BIFF. We booked over 30 artists to play at the Boulder Theater and to entertain at the festival parties. This provides much-needed exposure for local musicians.

Boulder Creek Festival

RMP provides booking and curation services for the community stage for the Boulder Creek Festival. This year we are featuring artists from our Songwriters Workshop. Over 100,000 people attend the Festival, making it the biggest event of the year for many local musicians.

























Community partnerships and collaborations

Venue Grant Program

Each year, RMP provides eleven free venue rentals to arts groups through the City of Boulder Venue Grant Program.

Streetwise Mural

Streetwise non-profit awarded a grant for the installation of a mural at RMP as part of their Colorado Black Artist series.

Internships

RMP has an active high school internship program that teaches industry skills in a real world environment.


Watch the Music Grow



Use of Funds




(a) 2024 Total Expense Budget One Million
